## RESTRAINING ORDER

This is a **Restraining Order** issued under the authority of section 46 of the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 (PCCA, 2005). As the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges, I HEREBY ORDER 1639890 Ontario Inc. operating as Global Driver Training School (Global Driver Training) TO STOP OPERATING IN CONTRAVENTION OF THE PRIVATE CAREER COLLEGES ACT, 2005 (PCCA, 2005).

The detailed reasons supporting my order are set out in Schedule A, attached. In brief, Global Driver Training is advertising an unregistered private career college and advertising unapproved vocational programs, contrary to subsections 11(1) and (2) of that Act, respectively.

Global Driver Training must provide written confirmation signed by a person with authority to bind the school, together with all available supporting evidence, that the steps outlined below have been taken. This written confirmation must be delivered **immediately** by registered mail or courier to my attention and confirm that Global Driver Training:

- has stopped advertising itself as a private career college and has stopped advertising unapproved vocational programs.

If Global Driver Training is currently providing unapproved vocational programs as an unregistered Private Career College, these actions would be contrary to sections 7 and 8 of the PCCA, 2005 respectively. Global Driver Training would then be required to **immediately** take the steps outlined below in this order to comply with the PCCA, 2005.

Specifically, Global Driver Training:

1. must stop operating as a private career college;
2. must stop providing unapproved vocational programs;
3. must stop enrolling students in unapproved vocational programs;
4. must provide the ministry with a list including the names and addresses of all current and former students;
5. must provide refunds to students who were enrolled in unapproved vocational programs;
6. must not hold, directly or indirectly, any monies owing to current, former, or prospective students of unapproved vocational programs;
7. must hold student files to be available for the Superintendent's staff to review; and
8. must not reopen until such time, if any, as it is registered.

### **Consequences of Failure to Comply with this Order**

Failure to comply with this order may result in any or all of the following actions by the Superintendent:

1. Application for a court order from the Superior Court of Justice to compel Global Driver Training to comply;
2. The issuance of further Administrative Monetary Penalties.
3. Prosecution for the offence of failure to comply. Upon conviction by a court of that offence, a corporation is subject to a fine of up to \$100,000; an individual, including an officer or director of a corporation who concurs in the commission of the offence, is subject to a fine of up to \$25,000, a prison term of up to one year, or both.

## Schedule A – Detailed Reasons for Decision

### Background

Global Driver Training operates an active website <http://www.globaldrivertraining.com/> which advertises an AZ license program, a DZ license program and a forklifting program. The site states that that this can be achieved within 6 weeks.

In a letter dated April 5, 2007, the Ministry informed Global Driver Training that their Professional Truck Driver Training Program “requires approval with the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges as it is intended to provide students with the skills and knowledge required to obtain employment in a recognized vocation.”

In another email dated March 5, 2009, the Ministry informed Global Driver Training in response to a pre-screening for a program entitled Heavy Equipment Operator, that they needed to register both their Professional Truck Driver Training Program and the Heavy Equipment Operator program. The Heavy Equipment Operator program costs \$4,895.00 and is 156 hours in length over a period of 6 weeks

### Legal and Operating Entities

The legal name is 1639890 Ontario Inc. The corporate address is 371 Pine Valley Drive, Kitchener, Ontario. It was incorporated on March 9, 2005. The corporation has two operating names; Global Driver Training School which was registered on November 15, 2006 and S&R Media Graphics which was registered on April 18, 2007.

### Contravention of Subsection 11(1) of the PCCA, 2005 – Advertising Unregistered Private Career College.

Global Driver Training operates an active website <http://www.globaldrivertraining.com/> which advertises an AZ license program, a DZ license program and a forklifting program. The site states that that this can be achieved within 6 weeks

A phone call was made by ministry staff to Global Driver Training on January 12, 2010 inquiring about the AZ program. A male answered the phone and identified the number as belonging to Global Driver Training . He stated the price for the AZ program to be \$2,750.00 with \$250.00 for the Z program. The program would take anywhere from 4 – 6 weeks.

A further phone call by ministry staff to Global Driver Training on January 13, 2010 confirmed that the AZ program was \$3,000.00 and 120 hours in length.

Based on the previous correspondence with the Ministry and the two phone calls to verify price and length, the AZ program fits the definition of a vocational

program according to the PCCA, 2005. Therefore the school is contravening the PCCA, 2005 by advertising an unregistered vocational program and therefore advertising itself as a Private Career College .
