NOTICE OF CONTRAVENTION

This letter is to inform you as the director/president of Niagara on the Lake Culinary School Inc. ("School") that on February 11, 2010 it was determined that the School contravened the following section(s) of the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* ("Act") and/or regulations made under the Act:

- Act, s. 11 — Restrictions on advertising and soliciting (\$1,000)
- Act, s. 8 (1) – Prohibition against providing vocational programs (\$1,000)
- Act. s. 9 of the PCCA, 2005 – Prohibition Against Charging Fee (\$1,000)

For a Summary of each contravention see attached Schedule A.

As per section 51 of *Ontario Regulation 415/06* of the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* Niagara on the Lake Culinary School Inc. is required to pay penalties totalling \$3000 within **30 days** of the date of this notice. If payment is not received within **30 days** after the date the notice of contravention was received, the amount will be subject to interest at the current postjudgment interest rate beginning on the 31st day following the date of notice. Schedule “A”

Act, s. 11 — Restrictions on advertising and soliciting (\$1,000)

On January 28, 2010 the website belonging to Niagara on the Lake Culinary School Inc., was reviewed by the Superintendent’s staff, who found it was advertising a “Hotel and Restaurant Program”. The name of the approved program is “Hotel Management Diploma Program”.

Act, s. 8 (1) – Prohibition against providing vocational programs (\$1,000)

A review of student files in February 2010 showed that two students had been enrolled in The Baker Pastry Chef Diploma Program before it was approved by the Superintendent.

Act. s. 9 – Prohibition Against Charging Fee (\$1,000)

Records from the School show that two students had paid fees to the school to become enrolled in the Baker Pastry Chef Diploma Program prior to its approval by the Superintendent under the Act.
