

## Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision

S. 49(1) *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005*

April 1, 2011

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>PCCA, s. 11 - Restrictions on advertising and soliciting</p> <p>On June 25, 2010, a Designate telephoned the number listed on the website belonging to the school (416-745-1977) and spoke to an individual who identified himself as Pritam and who confirmed that the Designate was calling "PG Truck Driver School." Pritam advised the Designate that they offer a "full" course which is 6 weeks in duration for 4 hours per day (120 hours total). Lessons are 45 minutes in length and the total cost of this program is \$3,000. Pritam told the Designate that payment could be made upfront or in instalment payments.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty was reduced to \$500 per day for the period of December 8, 2010 – December 14, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates Pritam Grewal was advertising an unregistered private career college and unapproved vocational training.</p>

<p>PCCA, s. 7 Prohibition against operating a private career college</p> <p>On October 29, 2010, Designates visited the school at 1694 Albion Road, Suite 7, Toronto and met with Pritam Grewel, who identified himself as the owner of the school. Student files were found at the premises for vocational training falling under the Act containing the school's letterhead, address and contact information.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty was reduced to \$500 per day for the period of December 8, 2010 – December 14, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that Pritam Grewel was holding itself out as a registered private career college.</p>
<p>PCCA, s. 8 (1) Prohibition against providing vocational programs</p> <p>During the October 29, 2010 field visit to the school, Designates reviewed the following student files which show that Mr. Grewel is delivering unapproved vocational truck training for a fee, even though his school has not been registered as a private career college since September 22, 2009.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty was reduced to \$500 per day for the period of December 8, 2010 – December 14, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that Pritam Grewel was providing unapproved vocational programs.</p>
<p>PCCA, 2005, s. 9 - Prohibition against charging a fee.</p> <p>During the October 29, 2010 field visit to the school, Designates reviewed the student file for [REDACTED] and found it contained a student enrolment form dated June 17, 2010 for a \$2,500 package with the signature of the student on the form. The top of the Student Enrolment Form has the following text "The one and only choice for best professional training P.G. Truck and Forklift Driving School." A separate written agreement with the school's letterhead, name of the school and address is signed by the student with text specifying the contract is for \$2,500 for AZ for unlimited road tests and lessons.</p> <p>Student credit card receipts totalling \$1,430 were also found in this student's file.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty was reduced to \$500 per day for the period of December 8, 2010 – December 14, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that Pritam Grewel was charging fees for unapproved vocational programs.</p>
<p>PCCA, 2005, s. 38 (10) - Inquiry and Examination - obstruction</p> <p>When Mr. Grewel was questioned as to whether he had offered any longer programs recently, he said that he had not offered it for several years. However, during the October 29, 2010 field visit to the school, Designates reviewed the student file for [REDACTED] and found it contained a student enrolment form, dated June 17, 2010, for a contract for a \$2,500 AZ program</p>	<p>\$1,000</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is upheld.</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that Pritam Grewel did obstruct the duties of the Superintendent's designates while they were conducting an examination/inquiry.</p>
