Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision

S. 49 (1) Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 (“Act”)

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>Act, s. 8 (1) — Prohibition against providing vocational programs</p> <p>Designates of the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges called TwoBrothers Enterprise Corp. (the “School”) on September 10, 2012 and on December 10, 2012 to inquire about tractor-trailer (“AZ”) driver training. The School indicated on September 10, 2012 that it could provide AZ training for \$2,000 per student over the course of 200 hours and, on December 10, 2012, for \$3,000 per student over the course of about one month.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is rescinded.</p> <p>The balance of the evidence does not indicate that the School was actually offering or providing its unapproved vocational programs to students. From a Designate of the Superintendent’s conversation with a representative of the School, the School was not indicating that it could start training students in its unapproved vocational programs.</p>

<p>Act, s. 11 — Restrictions on advertising and soliciting</p> <p>As “New & Safe Truck Driving School,” the School was advertising the following driver licensing training on a Chinese language website: A, B, C, D, and Z.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is upheld. The penalty accumulated from January 31, 2013 to February 6, 2013.</p> <p>The balance of the evidence indicates that the School was advertising unapproved vocational programs.</p> <p>The School was clearly advised in the ministry’s 2011 pre-screening response that it was prohibited from advertising or offering its vocational programs prior to registering and obtaining program approval.</p> <p>Original penalty: \$7,000 Penalty following review: \$7,000</p>
