### NOTICE OF CONTRAVENTION

This letter is to inform you as the Director of Education Canada Career College Inc. known as Education Canada College (Education Canada College) that on July 26, 2010, it was determined that (Education Canada College) contravened the following section(s) of the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* and/or regulations made under the Act:

Act, s. 11 — Restrictions on advertising and soliciting (\$1,000)

This notice amends the Notice of Contravention #86 issued on July 26, 2010 by identifying as the director of Education Canada College. New evidence indicates that the contraventions were committed by the above mentioned corporation in Quebec and not the director of the Ontario corporation of the same name.

For a Summary of each contravention see attached Schedule A.

As per section 51 of *Ontario Regulation 415/06* made under the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005,* Education Canada College is subject to a penalty in the total amount of \$1,000 per day. It is important to note that the penalty is levied daily. The total penalty amount is calculated by multiplying the penalty amount indicated above by the number of successive days that the contravention continues.

For example: following 5 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$5,000.

following 15 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$15,000.

At this time you are required to provide the ministry with written confirmation of compliance with the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* and its regulations. Specifically, written confirmation that Education Canada College:

 has stopped advertising an unregistered Private Career College and unapproved vocational programs that require approval.

Once you have confirmed compliance with the Act, the penalties will cease to accumulate and you will receive an invoice that sets out the total penalty outstanding. Payment of the full amount is due within **30 days** of the date of your notification.

If payment is not received within **30 days** after the date the notice of contravention was received, the amount will be subject to interest at the current postjudgment interest rate beginning on the 31<sup>st</sup> day following the date of notice. #### Review

If you believe that the decision made above is inaccurate you may request a review of this decision by submitting a **Request for a Review of a Notice of Contravention** form to the Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities within **15 days** of receipt of the Notice of Contravention.
