**Accessibility for Ontarians with Disability Act** RE:

**Built Environment Standard** 

The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA) became law on June 13, 2005. The purpose of AODA is to achieve accessibility for Ontarians with disabilities with respect to goods, services, facilities, accommodation, employment, buildings, structures and premises on or before January 1, 2025, by developing, implementing and enforcing accessibility standards.

At this time a public review of the initial proposed Accessible Built Environment Standard is currently taking place. Everyone in Ontario is welcome to review and submit comments pertaining to the proposed standard until October 16, 2009.
