PARTICULARS OF A SECOND RESTRAINING ORDER

S. 49 (2) Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 ("Act")

February 4, 2013

These particulars are posted following the issuance of a Restraining Order against an unregistered private career college by the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges pursuant to s. 46 (1) of the Act.

Contraventions

The Superintendent has ordered Stouffville College Ltd. known as Stouffville College to stop:

- Providing a vocational program that requires approval, in contravention of section 8 (1) of the Act;
- Charging fees in relation to a vocational program unless the person is registered and the provision of the program has been approved by the Superintendent, in contravention of section 9 of the Act;

- Operating a private career college without being registered; in contravention of section 7 of the Act; and
- Advertising an unregistered private career college and an unapproved vocational program that requires approval, in contravention of subsections 11 (1) & 11 (2) of the Act.

Required Actions

By February 8, 2013, Stouffville College Ltd. known as Stouffville College is required by the Superintendent to provide written confirmation signed by a person with authority to bind the corporation, together with all available supporting evidence, confirming that they:

- A. Have stopped providing a vocational program, namely the ACCA program, that requires approval, in contravention of section 8 (1) of the Act;
- B. Have stopped charging fees in relation to a vocational program, namely the ACCA program, unless the person is registered and the provision of the program has been approved by the Superintendent, in contravention of section 9 of the Act;
- C. Have stopped operating a private career college without being registered; in contravention of section 7 of the Act; and
- D. Have stopped advertising an unregistered private career college and an unapproved vocational program, namely the ACCA program, that requires approval, in contravention of subsections 11 (1) & 11 (2) of the Act.
